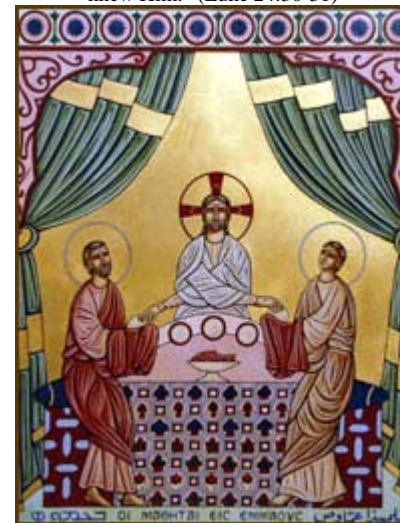
PASTOR'S CORNER
